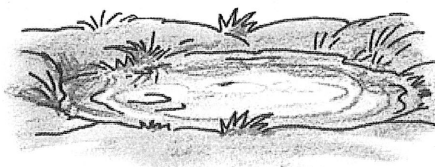
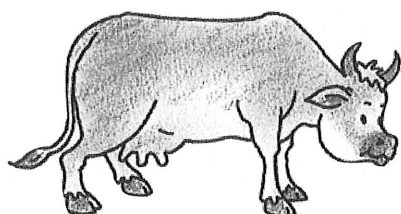
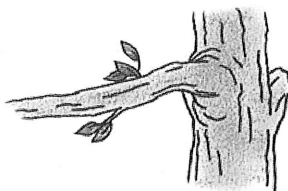
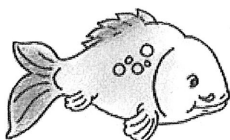
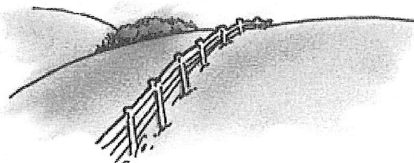
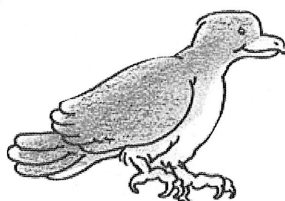
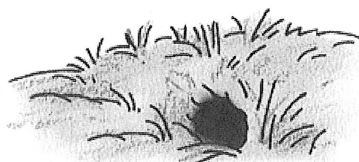
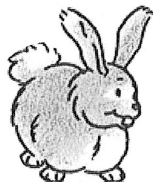
Animal homes

Animals are found in many different places. Some live in gardens, some live in forests, others live in ponds, or in the ocean.

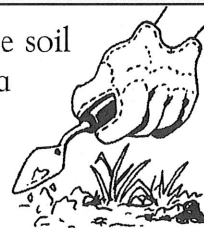
Science activity

Science exploration

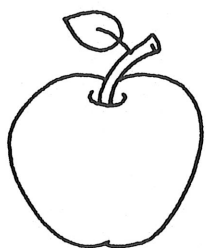

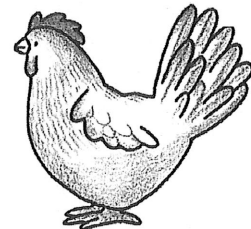
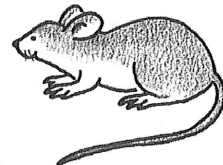
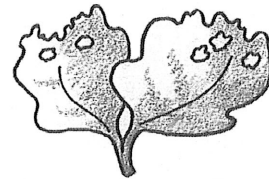
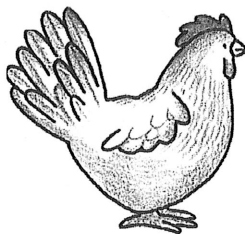
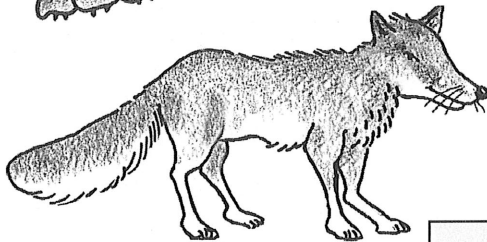
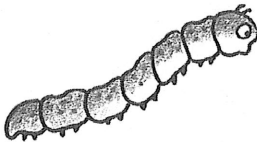
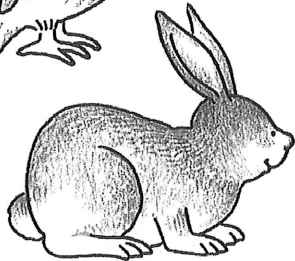
Staying alive
