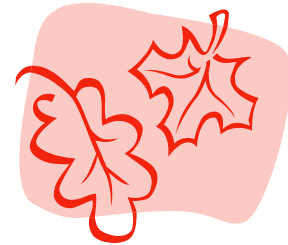

Layoverland by Gabby Noone

How can a book about death and the afterlife make you laugh until your sides split and while you catch your breath, spin around and make you cry just as hard?

Gabby Noone manages this feat in her book Layoverland.

The story follows the character Bea Fox, a sarcastic and vengeful teen who is pretty sure she deserves to be punished for eternity after dying in a car crash... only to end up in purgatory instead. Purgatory bears a striking resemblance to a low-budget airport — mediocre and boring — and in order to have a chance to go to heaven, Bea must help 5,000 souls figure out what is keeping them from progressing to their afterlife. Bea is fully prepared to take on this venture, until one of her clients winds up being Caleb, the boy responsible for the car crash that killed her.

This story oozes with karmic justice, contemplates the fairness of existence and meditates on forgiveness (even for those who feel they don't deserve it).

All in all, Gabby Noone has created a book that makes the afterlife feel both ordinary and extraordinary at the same time.
