Highlights from Days gone by.,, stories from McCord Library's Historical files

"The Candy Store"

(Note: this story is from a series of stories set around the early 1900s taken from our oral histories collection)

"Pease's Emporium located where the Concord Pharmacy is now was my favorite spot. The toys and story books were there to be sure by the candy counter along the west side of the store well up front captured my attention with eager eyes. Licorice whips with woven handles, belts studded with pink, white, yellow button trim and buttons made like mother used to sew our clothes, holes in the center for thread to pass through. The sugar spun candies fashioned in many shapes very likely these with parasols, pony carts, express wagons, dogs, cats, Indians, cowboys. All colored in colors suitable to melt in one's mouth. The fat chocolates with creamy centers looked like a chocolate covered hill. The tiny pans with the creamy mixture and the tiny spoon so one could get out every bit. The peppermint, anise, and lemon drops were never a first choice. The pennies carefully saved for such treats were wisely spent and the time selecting the goodies was a highlight of the day."
