What is a hotspot?

A hotspot is a device that allows a user to have wireless Internet on their phone, tablet, or computer even if they don't have Internet access at home. Simply connect to the hotspot using the WiFi menu on your device.

- Hotspots check out for 10 days
- Hotspots may only be checked out by adults
- Hotspots are only available to McCord patrons
- Fines for overdue hotspots are \$1 per day
