INSTRUCTIONS:

- Remove a small piece of fiberfill and stuff the arms, legs and head of the bear until they are filled up. It's helpful to use the eraser end of a pencil to push the stuffing into the arms or leg.
- Put more fiberfill until the torso is also filled.Note: You want to put enough fiberfill so that the bear can sit without sagging.
- Seal up the bear by closing the Velcro on the back.
- 4. Tie a ribbon around the bear's neck and make a bow.

Optional: use vest pattern on the back of these instructions to make a vest for your bear using a scrap piece of fabric.

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Cutting Pattern for the Vest

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T-Shirt Ring Toy

You'll need:

- A gallon bottle ring (piece left over after unscrewing the cap for the first time)
- A t-shirt cut into ½ inch wide strips a minimum of 12 inches long.
- Discard the sleeves and neck collar areas.

Instructions:

- 1. Put 1 strip through the ring and tie a double knot.
- 2. Repeat knotting strips onto the ring until ring is covered.

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No-Sew Sock Bunny



Materials provided:

- 1 sock (use solid color or small pattern)
- 1 ribbon
- Dry uncooked rice
- Stuffing
- 3 rubber bands
- 2 googly eyes
- 1 pink pom pom for nose



Not included:

- Scissors
- Glue

Directions:



1. Start by filling the sock with rice

RICE MUST GO IN FIRST!



2. Fill with HALF the stuffing provided



- 3. Put rubber band at the neck—make sure it's tight!
- 4. Fill the head with stuffing
- 5. Tie a rubber band at top of head



6. Make a tail at base of body with rubber band should have both rice and stuffing inside



7. Using scissors, cut ears from sock

Make sure your scissors are SHARP– Kids ask for help



- 8. Using glue, glue on the eyes and nose
- 9. Tie the ribbon on

Notes:

- You can make different colored bunnies using different socks
- Try different ribbons, flowers, and other accessories to make your bunny unique
- You can vary the size of the bunny based on the size of the sock

Bath Fizzies

In your kit:

- Dry mix
- Baby Oil
- Plastic egg

Instructions:

- 1. Using a mixing bowl stir dry mix with a fork until uniform (no lumps!)
- 2. Add a few drops of the baby oil and stir
- 3. Continue to add drops of oil until mix sticks together but is still crumbly
- 4. Put mix into one half plastic egg, pushing so no air remains
- 5. Fill other half of egg with remaining mix Your kit may not fill the whole egg!
- 6. Store in egg until ready to use
- 7. Slide bath fizzie out of egg and toss it into your bath
- 8. Wash and dry egg to reuse





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

- 4. Glue or tape animal outline to the painting





- 6. Using black paint, paint inside the stencil outline
- 7. LET PAINTING DRY COMPLETELY
- 8. Remove stencil


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


Make a book



- Hole punched paper




Directions:

- 3. Tie at knot at the end of the yarn








Choose how you'd like to lace your book




Your book has 3 holes. There are many ways to lace your book. Here are 3.




A:

Lace in one direction through all the holes



B:

- 1. Cut your yarn into three pieces
- 2. Pull yarn through each hole
- 3. Tie a knit in each



C:

- 1. Start at the top hole
- 2. Loop around the stack of pages from the hole
- 3. Pull through next hole from behind
- 4. Loop around the stack of pages
- 5. Pull through from above
- 6. Repeat until done

Materials provided:


- Thread

- Hole punched paper





- 1. Thread your needle







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
