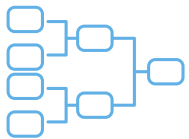

- Poems can be submitted anonymously, but no prize will be given if an anonymous submission wins

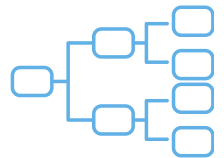
JUDGING GUIDELINES:


