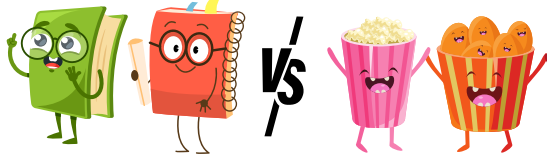

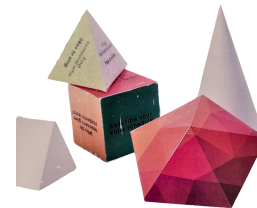

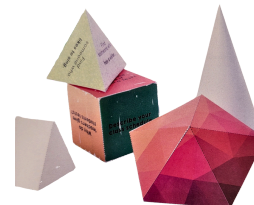

Freestyle Skiing



From the moment the downhill plural occupation leave the verb ending in 'ing' gates until the second they verb across the finish line, this Olympic event is a/an part of the body -pounding experience!
